OLD BUSINESS:

1. District Budget Presentation: Site council members attended budget presentations in October and February.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Staffing/Budget for next year – the district budget development process is underway. A plus 2 PTR is pretty much a done deal at the high school level. This result in a loss of 6.5 teachers in the district. 3 of those teachers will be from KCHS.
2. Bell Schedule next year – KCHS will be transitioning from a 6 period day to a 7 period day. We will be matching up with SOHI to share resources. The school schedules will be identical. FOL will be added to KCHS and will offer both enrichment and intervention opportunities.
3. KPBSD Strategic Plan draft feedback – reviewed the district plan. Feedback: - Value comes not from just writing these plan or from sharing them. Value comes from the application. – Concerned for potential loss of high school experience.

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The ability of students to have the maturity and motivations to be task oriented self-sufficient. Loss of engagement and relationships. – Need to add a Relationships aspect to the plan. The potential for student success is in relationships. – Leaves gap in needs for students who do not have strong parental support and influence.

4. State Assessment PEAKS – new assessment will be given to 9th and 10th grade students April 18-20.
